Pastor's Message

By Rev Jerry Ledbetter...

"Let everything that has breath praise the Lord. Praise the Lord." - Psalm 150:6(NIV)

You're surely aware that over the last few years I have struggled at times with my voice. Sudden and unexplained laryngitis hits time and again (since having COVID five years ago), and it often makes it difficult for me to share the Gospel I love, and feel called to preach! But there is a silver ling: for the difficulty has made me even more determined to share God's Word with every breath, so long as God wills it.

Of course, every breath we take is a gift from God-a constant testament to His sustaining power. But breath isn't just for staying alive; it's meant to give life to something greater: the Gospel. When we recognize that each inhale is grace and each exhale is an opportunity, we begin to live with gospel intentionality.

The Good News is not just a message we hear on Sundays or read in Scripture; it's the power of God for salvation (Romans

1:16), the hope for a weary world, and the light that pierces through darkness. And we, the redeemed, are its messengers.

Giving voice to the gospel doesn't always mean preaching. It's speaking truth in love at the dinner table, offering words of peace in the chaos of life, singing praises even in suffering, and living in such a way that our actions echo the words of Christ.

Paul wrote in 2 Corinthians 5:20, "We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making His appeal through us." If we truly believe that, then every word we speak -and even the way we listen-should be soaked in Gospel grace. Even our silence can carry His presence when it's filled with compassion, prayer, and peace.

So, what would it look like to give voice to the gospel with every breath today?

- A gentle answer when anger would be easier?
- An encouraging word when someone is doubting?
- A whispered prayer on behalf of the hurting?
- A bold testimony when fear tempts you to stay quiet?

God doesn't just ask us to breathe-He invites us to breathe out the Good News of Christ.

Lord, thank You for the breath in my lungs and the life You've given me. May every word from my mouth reflect Your love, truth and grace-as long as you grant me voice! And may that voice be an instrument of Your gospel-speaking life, hope, and salvation. Teach me to live each moment aware of Your presence and bold in sharing Your good news.

Her helpers are Mrs. Debbie, and Mr. Randy (the Candyman), and for special events Mrs. Helen, and Mrs. LaChelle.




Sunday school 10:00 am-10:50 am Children's Church 11:00 am - 12:00 pm





We at the Fuller Center for Housing believe that: We are part of a God movement, and movements don't just stop. We have been called to this housing ministry; we didn't just stumble into it. We are unashamedly Christian, and enthusiastically ecumenical. We aren't a church but we are a servant of the Church. We are faith-driven, knowing that after we've done all we can do the Lord will help finish the job — something that requires us to stretch beyond our rational reach. We are a grass-roots ministry, recognizing that the real work happens on the ground in communities around the world through our covenant partners — so a large, overseeing bureaucracy isn't needed. We try to follow the teachings of the Bible and believe that it says that we shouldn't charge interest of the poor, so we don't. Government has a role in our work in helping set the stage, but that we shouldn't look to it as a means to fund the building of homes.

A knock at the door might not seem like a big deal to many of us. But, to a homebound senior, it could signal the arrival of the only person they might see all day or all week long. It brings hope. It brings health. It brings the nutrition and care that will completely make their day. A knock from Meals on Wheels can even save lives.
